COMPLAINT FOR PATENT INFRINGEMENT

Plaintiff Shellef Holdings, Inc. ("Shellef") hereby submits this Complaint for patent infringement against Defendants CRC Industries, Inc. ("CRC Industries"), Fastenal Company ("Fastenal"), Motion Industries, Inc. ("Motion Indus."), Rexel USA, Inc. ("Rexel"), and W.W. Grainger, Inc. ("Grainger")¹ and alleges as follows:

NATURE OF THE ACTION

- 1. This is an action for patent infringement arising under the Patent Laws of the United States, 35 U.S.C. §1 *et seq*.
- 2. Defendants have infringed and continue to infringe, have induced and continue to induce others to infringe, and have contributed and continue to contribute to others' infringement of U.S. Patent No. 9,816,057 ("the '057 patent"). A true and correct copy of the '057 patent is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

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¹ Fastenal, Motion Indus., Rexel, and Grainger are collectively referred to as "Distributor Defendants." The Distributor Defendants together with CRC Industries are collectively referred to as "Defendants."

3. Shellef thus files this Complaint seeking judgement of and damages, injunctive, and other relief for Defendants' infringement of the '057 patent.

BACKGROUND

A. Shellef

- 49. Shellef owns a portfolio of patents covering novel solvent formulations. Among Shellef's patents is the '057 patent.
- 50. The '057 patent resulted from the pioneering efforts of Mr. Edo Shellef, Mr. Dov Shellef, and Mr. Richard DeGroot (collectively "the Inventors") to make compositions that include trans-1,2-dichloroethylene ("t-DCE") nonflammable and more environmentally friendly.
- 51. t-DCE is an effective cleaner. However, before 2014, its use for cleaning purposes had been relatively limited because it is highly flammable. Prior methods to provide "nonflammable" t-DCE involved mixing t-DCE with compounds like hydrochlorofluorocarbons ("HCFCs") and hydrofluorocarbons ("HFCs"). The use of those compounds, however, has became highly disfavored because of their negative impact on the environment.
- 52. The '057 patent is directed to a class of novel non-flammable degreaser formulations that include t-DCE and other components. For example, the '057 patent discloses embodiments of formulations for solvent, non-azeotropic compositions that combine t-DCE with other components, e.g., HFE and/or n-propyl bromide, to achieve nonflammability.
- 53. Rendering t-DCE nonflammable is a significant benefit of the embodiments in the '057 patent. It allows consumers to take advantage of t-DCE's exceptional cleaning power and lower toxicity while keeping consumers safer. One or more of the disclosed embodiments in the '057 patent can be used in a variety of applications, including cleaning agents, degreasers, and solvents in industrial processes. They are compatible with a wide range of materials and processes, making them versatile for different industrial applications.
- 54. Another significant benefit of certain embodiments in the '057 patent is the use of HFE, which can avoid mixing t-DCE with ozone depleting compounds, such as HCFCs, and

greenhouse gases, like HFCs. One or more of the disclosed embodiments are also substantially less expensive to manufacture than other available alternatives.

B. Defendants

- 55. Upon information and belief, CRC Industries produces specialty chemicals for maintenance, repair and operational professionals and do-it-yourselfers, serving the automotive, industrial, electrical, marine, heavy truck, hardware and aviation markets. Among CRC's product offerings are branded cleaners, degreasers, and other cleaning solvents that incorporate two specific compounds relevant here: [1] t-DCE and [2] HFE, for example, HFE-347.
- 56. Those products include, for example, Cable Clean® Degreaser, Cable Clean® High Voltage Splice and Termination Cleaner, Lectra Force Electrical Cleaner, Contact Cleaner 2000® Precision Cleaner, NT® Precision Cleaner, Aviation T-Force® Degreaser, Contact Cleaner 2000® VC Precision Cleaner, T-Force® Degreaser MUO, and T-Force® PowerJet® Degreaser MUO.
- 57. Upon information and belief, Fastenal is a distributor and/or reseller of CRC Industries' products, including one or more of the products listed in paragraph 69. For example, Fastenal offers to sell and sells CRC® Cable Clean® High Voltage Splice and Termination Cleaner (https://www.fastenal.com/product/details/0603822) and T-Force® PowerJet® Degreaser MUO (https://www.fastenal.com/product/details/0612726).

C. Notice of the '057 Patent and Shellef's Infringement Concerns

- 61. On November 17, 2023, Shellef's counsel sent a letter to Len Mazzanti, Chief Executive Officer of CRC Industries, notifying CRC Industries of the '057 patent and Shellef's concern that the industrial degreasing products being manufactured and/or sold by CRC Industries infringed the '057 patent, including those products identified above in paragraph 56. Shellef also notified CRC Industries of its concern that CRC Industries' customers infringe the '057 patent when they use or resale CRC Industries' industrial degreasing products.
- 62. The parties exchanged correspondence between December 2023 and June 2024 in effort to resolve this dispute via a patent license. They were unable to reach an agreement.


- 63. On July 5, 2024, CRC Industries filed a complaint for a declaratory judgment of non-infringement and invalidity of claims 1-20 of the '057 Patent in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Complaint for Declaratory Judgment, *CRC Industries, Inc. v. Shellef Holdings, Inc.*, No. 2:24-cv-02952-KBH (E.D. Pa. July 5, 2024), ECF No. 1. On September 20, 2024, Shellef filed a motion to dismiss CRC Industries' declaratory judgment action for lack of personal jurisdiction pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 12(b)(2). Motion to Dismiss Plaintiff's Complaint for Lack of Personal Jurisdiction and Brief In Support Thereof, *CRC Industries, Inc. v. Shellef Holdings, Inc.*, No. 2:24-cv-02952-KBH (E.D. Pa. Sept. 20, 2024), ECF Nos. 19, 19-1.
- 64. Distributor Defendants have had knowledge of the '057 patent and Shellef's concerns they were infringing that patent at least as of the filing and service of this complaint.

By way of example, the Accused Products are CRC Industries' cleaning products, such as its Cable Clean® Degreaser, Cable Clean® High Voltage Splice and Termination Cleaner, Lectra Force Electrical Cleaner, Contact Cleaner 2000® Precision Cleaner, NT® Precision Cleaner, Aviation T-Force® Degreaser, Contact Cleaner 2000® VC Precision Cleaner, T-Force® Degreaser MUO, and T-Force® PowerJet® Degreaser MUO.

Defendants direct, cause, instruct, and/or encourage their customers to apply the Accused Products to a surface and spread or rub the Accused Products on the surface to cold clean the surface (degrease). Such use directly infringes at least claim 9 of the '057 patent, either literally or under the doctrine of equivalents, and Defendants are inducing that infringement.
- 94. With knowledge of the '057 patent and infringement thereof, CRC Industries has induced and is inducing its distributors and resellers, including the Distributor Defendants, to directly infringe the '057 patent by directing, causing, instructing, and/or encouraging its distributors and resellers to offer to sell and sell the Accused Products. The offer to sell and sale of the Accused Products, without authorization from Shellef, constitutes infringement, either

literally or under the doctrine of equivalents, of one more claims of the '057 patent, including at least claim 8, by such customers. *Supra* at ¶¶69-92 (incorporated herein by reference).

- 95. On information and belief, the Accused Products are used, marketed, provided to, and/or used by or for Defendants' partners, clients, customers, and end users across the country and in this District.
- 96. CRC Industries' infringement of the '057 patent has been and continues to be willful and deliberate. CRC Industries has been on notice of the '057 patent and its infringement thereof since at least November 17, 2023, when Shellef, through its counsel, notified Mr. Mazzanti, CEO of CRC Industries, of the '057 patent and Shellef's infringement concerns. Notwithstanding, on information and belief, CRC Industries has knowingly, deliberately and/or intentionally continued to engage in the above-described infringing acts despite a known or so obvious that it should have been known to CRC Industries that its conduct amounted to infringement of the '057 patent. CRC Industries' infringement is ongoing.
- 97. Distributor Defendants' infringement of the '057 patent has been and continues to be willful and deliberate. Each of those defendants have been on notice of the '057 patent and its infringement thereof at least as of the filing and service of this complaint. Notwithstanding, on information and belief, Distributor Defendants have each knowingly, deliberately and/or intentionally continued to engage in the above-described infringing acts despite a known or so obvious that it should have been known to each defendant that its conduct amounted to infringement of the '057 patent. Distributor Defendants' infringement is ongoing.
- 98. Shellef has been irreparably harmed by Defendants' infringing activities. It has suffered and will continue to suffer damages in an amount to be proved at trial.

JURY DEMAND

99. Pursuant to Rule 38 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Shellef demands a trial by jury on all issues triable as such.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

- 100. WHEREFORE, Shellef prays for the following relief:
 - a. A judgment that Defendants have directly infringed the '057 patent;
 - b. A judgment that Defendants have induced infringement of the '057 patent;
 - c. A judgment that Defendants have contributed to infringement of the '057 patent;
 - d. An order enjoining Defendants, their officers, agents, employees, and those persons in active concert or participation with any of them, and Defendants' successors and assigns, from continuing to infringe the '057 patent;
 - e. An award of damages pursuant to 35 U.S.C. §284 to be paid by Defendants adequate to compensate Shellef for Defendants' past infringement of the '057 patent, including supplemental damages for any infringing acts not covered by the jury's verdict, including any continuing post-verdict infringement up and until entry of final judgment, with an accounting of all infringing acts including, but not limited to, those acts not presented at trial;
 - f. An order finding that Defendants' infringement has been willful and increasing the damages awarded to Shellef to three times the amount assessed pursuant to 35 U.S.C. § 284;
 - g. A declaration that this case is exceptional under 35 U.S.C. §285, and an award of Shellef's reasonable attorneys' fees; and
 - h. An award of Shellef's prejudgment and post-judgment interest on its damages;
 - i. An award of Shellef's costs;
 - j. An order awarding Shellef an ongoing royalty pursuant to 35 U.S.C. §283 for any continuing post-judgment infringement, with an accounting provided quarterly; and
 - k. An award to Shellef of such further relief at law or in equity as the Court deems just and proper.
